# Code of Conduct for Parents, Carers & Spectators

## *For the All England Taekwon-Do Association*

### Introduction

This code of conduct is the guideline on common standards of conduct & behaviour to be adhered to by all Parents, Carers and Spectators whilst observing classes / events hosted by The All England Taekwon-Do Association (AETA).

The purpose of this code of conduct is to fulfil goals and objectives laid out in The All England Taekwon-Do Association (AETA) Safeguarding policy.

1. Parents / Carers / Spectators must not take any photos or videos in classes without prior consent or arrangement.
2. Parents / Carers / Spectators should model good behaviour and set good examples.
3. Parents / Carers / Spectators must stay within the law whilst attending classes and or events.
4. Parents / Carers / Spectators should treat students and instructors fairly and without prejudice or discrimination.
5. Parents / Carers / Spectators must ensure their contact with students and instructors is appropriate and done in a manner that does not involve disrupting a class or event or singling out a student or instructor.
6. Parents / Carers / Spectators should contribute towards providing a safe environment for students and instructors and should not to use aggressive or intimidating behaviour.
7. Parents / Carers / Spectators should not disrupt a class, event or student. They can approach and discuss incidents with an instructor when the class is finished in a confidential manner.
8. Parents / Carers / Spectators have a duty of care to report any concerns they have witnessed at a class or event to either an instructor or a safeguarding or welfare officer.
